Eligibility for Assistance in Preparing for the California High School Exit Examination (CAHSEE) after Grade 12 (Valenzuela Settlement)

This notice shall be posted permanently in regional offices of the schools and programs operated by the Riverside County Office of Education that serves students in grades 10-12.

ATTENTION: PARENTS, GUARDIANS, AND STUDENTS

The law provides the following rights to students, including English learners, who have not passed one or both parts of the California High School Exit Examination (CAHSEE) by the end of grade 12 (eligible student):

1. The right to receive intensive instruction and services for up to two consecutive academic years after completion of grade 12 or until both parts of the CAHSEE are passed, whichever comes first;
2. The right of English learners to receive services to improve English proficiency as needed to pass those parts of the CAHSEE not yet passed for up to two consecutive academic years after completion of grade 12 or until both parts of the CAHSEE are passed, whichever comes first; and
3. The right to file a complaint if there is evidence of a deficiency rated to the provision of intensive instruction and services to an eligible student.
