RIVERSIDE COUNTY MOCK TRIAL COMPETITION

The Riverside County Mock Trial is sponsored by Riverside County Office of Education (RCOE), Riverside County Bar Association (RCBA), and Riverside Superior Courts, in cooperation with the Constitutional Rights Foundation (CRF). The Mock Trial Steering Committee, made up of representatives of the legal and education community, are responsible for enforcing the rules and regulations of the competition. The chairperson of the Steering Committee is John Wahlin, Best, Best, and Krieger. The logistics of the event are handled through the Riverside County Office of Education where the contact is Tracey Rivas, Programs and Student Activities Facilitator.

Eligibility

The Riverside County Mock Trial competition is open to all public and private high schools in Riverside County, for students in grades 9 through 12. Each team participating will be responsible for presenting both the prosecution and the defense side of the case. Schools are only allowed to field one team, unless they are fielding a selected wild card team per the guidelines on page 4.

Registration Fee

The registration fee for each school team entering the competition is \$575. The fee helps to offset some expenses including case materials, awards, facility usage, etc. School teams that plan to participate must submit an Intent to Participate Form and the \$575 registration fee, payable to Riverside County Office of Education, by **Wednesday, September 28, 2011**. In the event a team withdraws from the competition after the September 28 date, only a portion of the registration fee will be refunded. (*Prior to January 1, 2012, 50% refunded; after January 1, 2012, 25% refunded.*)

Student Teams

Each team* consists of a minimum of 8 students with a maximum of 20 students, and 5 alternates (*total of 25*) from the same school. The team consists of the following members:

- One (1) Defense Pretrial Attorney (may **not** also be a Defense Trial Attorney)
- One (1) Prosecution Pretrial Attorney (may **not** also be a Prosecution Trial Attorney)
- Three (3) Defense Trial Attorneys (maximum)
- Three (3) Prosecution Trial Attorneys (maximum)
- Four (4) Defense Witnesses
- Four (4) Prosecution Witnesses
- One (1) Clerk
- One (1) Bailiff
- Five (5) Designated Alternates (*optional*) (*Alternates may be rotated in at the beginning of a round during competition.*)

*The winning county team that advances to the California Mock Trial Competition will be allowed to send 8 to 25 students (as the official team) to the state competition. The students must have been on the official county team roster to be eligible to participate.

The official team list and student participation forms are due to the Riverside County Office of Education by **Friday, December 9, 2011**. Changes to the team list will not be accepted after December 9, 2011. The team list will provide the correct names of all team members, teacher coaches, and attorney coaches.

Case Materials

Case materials, prepared and provided by the Constitutional Rights Foundation, and purchased by Riverside County Office of Education, are provided to participating teams at the orientation meeting to be held September 28, 2011. The material is the same for all schools competing in Mock Trial programs throughout the state.

Each participating team (teacher coach) will receive materials including the following information:

- Statement of the facts of the case.
- Set of sworn statements by witnesses.
- Materials explaining the steps in a trial, rules of evidence, proper questioning and guidelines for attorneys.
- Competition rules, time requirements, rating criteria.
- Sample judge and/or attorney score sheet.
- Activity sheets for teachers to use in preparing students and a bibliography of materials.
- Materials for a constitutional argument/pretrial motion.

The case materials will be distributed to teams **electronically** and each team will be responsible for duplicating copies for their team members.

Please note that Riverside County local rules deviate, in some cases, from the state rules. In the absence of a local rule regarding a specific issue, state (Constitutional Rights Foundation) rules are to be followed.

Judges and Scoring Attorneys

Judges and scoring attorneys volunteer their time to assist with the Mock Trial competition. The Riverside County Bar Association is a vital source in recruiting volunteers.

Teacher/School Advisor Coach

Each participating team must have a credentialed teacher employed at the team's school as the Mock Trial teacher coach. All correspondence and information related to the Mock Trial competition is distributed to the teacher coach. It is the responsibility of the teacher coach to share information with attorney coaches.

Attorney Coaches

It is recommended that each school/team recruit an attorney coach to work with their team well in advance of the Mock Trial competition. The most successful teams involve attorney coaches at the earliest possible time. If a school is unable to recruit an attorney coach and has exhausted all resources, contact Tracey Rivas, Programs and Student Activities Facilitator, (951) 826-6570. Attorney coaches needing assistance throughout the Mock Trial season should contact John Wahlin, Steering Committee Chairperson, (951) 826-8313.

Judicial Mentor

If desired by the teacher and attorney coach, schools may recruit a judicial mentor. The role of the judicial mentor may include assisting teams by judging and critiquing practice rounds. The mentor may also provide other assistance as agreed upon by the coaching staff and the judicial mentor.

Competition Rounds

Each team will compete in at least four (4) rounds of competition. After four (4) rounds of competition, the top eight (8) teams will compete in the Elite Eight competition; Round 5 is the Elite Eight Round. Based on win/loss and cumulative scores, the schools are ranked 1 through 8. Teams will be matched using the basketball tournament method, 1 vs. 8, etc. The winner is the team that wins the majority of scorecards, excluding ties. If there is a tie, the presiding judge's choice is the final tie breaker. Round 6 is the Semi-Final Round with four teams competing and the rules are the same. Round 7 is the Championship Round. The two remaining teams compete to determine the Championship Round winner who then goes on to represent Riverside County at the California State Mock Trial Competition.

Team Matching

Teams are invited to observe the random drawing for Round 1 pairings. For the 2012 competition, the Round 1 pairings drawing will be held on Thursday, January 5, 2012, at 4:30 p.m. Following is additional information about pairings for each round of competition:

Round 1 –

1. Random selection within the region prior to the first round of competition.
2. Scores for Round 1 will be used in aggregate scores.

Round 2 –

1. Round 1 prosecution becomes Round 2 defense and vice versa.
2. Teams will not go against same team as in Round 1.
3. Power match based on win/loss record, subject to numbers 1 and 2 above.

Round 3 –

1. Teams will not go against same team as in Rounds 1 and 2.
2. Power match subject to number 1 above.

Round 4 –

1. Prosecution in Round 3 will be defense in Round 4 and vice versa.
2. Teams can go up against a team they competed against in a previous round.
3. Power match subject to numbers 1 and 2 above.

Each team will compete in at least two defense rounds and two prosecution rounds during the competition.

Uneven Number of Entries – In the case that there are an uneven number of teams entering the competition, schools may volunteer to have a second team enter the event. From the schools that volunteer, a wildcard drawing will take place to select the team that will compete at the county level. The wildcard team that is picked will compete throughout the entire competition. The teams from the same school will not compete against each other in the first four rounds, but can face each other in the Elite 8.

Power Matching – Power matching will be in effect in Rounds 2, 3, and 4. After each round, teams will be ranked by win/loss record and by cumulative percentage points within their win/loss bracket. The top ranked team will then play the lowest ranked team in each bracket; the second ranked team will play the next to the lowest ranked team in the bracket, etc., subject to the various rules of competition.

Elite Eight/Semi-Final/Final Rounds – During the Elite Eight, Semi-Final, and Final rounds, if the teams are meeting for the first time, the higher seeded team will switch sides from the previous round. If the teams have met once before, they will reverse the roles of prosecution/defense. If the teams have met twice, a coin flip determines prosecution/defense.

Scoring

Team numbers are assigned at random. Judges and scoring attorneys will not use school names to identify teams.

In order to give more attention to presentations, arguments, and objections, the presiding judge will not score. The presiding judge will rule on the pretrial motion, preside over the trial, decide questions of rule violations, and deliver the guilty or not guilty verdict.

The Elite Eight and Semi-Final rounds will have five (5) scorers. Again, the presiding judge will not score.

At the end of each round, a designated attorney scorer will collect the time sheet, score sheets, and Blue Ribbon awards nomination sheets (*Blue Ribbon forms used for Rounds 1, 2, 3, and 4 only*) and deliver them to competition headquarters.

The score sheets are considered the working papers of the scoring attorneys. As a matter of policy, these sheets will not be released to schools. This policy protects the confidentiality of the working papers of all the volunteer attorneys who score the trials.

Team scores for Rounds 1, 2, 3, and 4 will be released to teacher coaches via fax the day after each round. Team scores will not be released for the Elite Eight, Semi-Final, or Final Round. The win/loss of each team will also be released within two days after each round.

For the first four rounds of competition, percentage point averaging will be used. The total points for the prosecution from all scoring attorneys will be added together and then divided by the total points for both sides to determine the percentage of the total points awarded. The same is done for the defense. The result determines a team score for that round. The presiding judge will break ties. Scores for Rounds 1, 2, 3, and 4, when added together, equal a team's cumulative points. In the event of a forfeiture as determined by the Steering Committee, the declared winner shall be awarded 60 percentage points and the forfeiting team 40 points.

Elite Eight Scoring – Each scoring attorney awards points as in the previous rounds. A team wins, loses, or ties on each scorecard. The team that wins the majority of the scorecards (excluding ties) is the winner. In the event of a tie (scores are 2-2-1 or 1-1-3), the presiding judge decides the winning team.

Timing

Timing rules set forth in the official materials, as modified by this section, shall be observed. Each team must furnish its own timing device. Each prosecution team will provide a clerk to conduct the official timing of each round. The timekeeper will stop the clock for witnesses coming into the courtroom, attorneys making objections, and when presiding judges are questioning attorneys and witnesses or when they are offering their observations. The clock will not be stopped if witnesses are asked to approach the exhibit.

Verbal warnings shall be given by the clerk before the end of each category. Time will not be rounded off, but will be kept as actual time i.e., two minutes, one minute and 30 seconds. Opening, closing, and rebuttal arguments

will not be timed separately, but time will be announced after the opening statement. Teams will automatically have one minute of their closing reserved for rebuttal. There is no need to request rebuttal time. The clerk will announce the total time elapsed and time remaining for each side following the opening argument and the examination of each of the first three witnesses on each side. These announcements shall be in addition to the final notifications for each presentation at two minutes, one minute, and 30 seconds. For example, if the prosecution uses 6:32 for direct examination of its first two witnesses, and the defense uses 4:11 for cross-examination, those times will be announced following the dismissal of the second witness.

Objections to the accuracy of the time at each point in the trial can only be made at that time. If there is no objection, the time to that point will be presumed to be correct. If an objection is made, the presiding judge will direct the clerk to review the time record and confirm whether or not an error has been made. If an error has been made, it will be corrected at that time. If the clerk concludes that the time as indicated is correct, the trial will proceed on that basis. There will be no specific point deduction for irregularities in timing, although the scoring attorneys may take this into account in scoring the overall team performance. There will be no unofficial timers as permitted by state rules.

Overtime Penalties

There will be a time limit for each section of the Mock Trial competition with no allowance for overtime. Students will be stopped at the end of the allotted time for each section. All witnesses must be called. Cross-examination is required for all witnesses. If the direct examination team runs out of time without calling one or more witnesses, the cross-examination team automatically will be awarded 10 points for each witness not called. The direct examination team will automatically receive a score of one for the witness performance and direct examination for each witness not called. No other witnesses may be called. If the cross-examination team runs out of time, the team will receive a cross-examination score of one for each witness not cross-examined.

Verdict

At the end of each round, the judge will announce the verdict (guilty/not guilty).

Conduct of the Trial

The rules governing the conduct of the pretrial motion and the trial, set forth in the Official Materials for the California Mock Trial Competition and the Mock Trial Simplified Rules of Evidence, shall be observed by all teams. Only the allowable evidentiary objections for Mock Trial may be used. Violations of these rules and the following rules shall be raised by objections from opposing team student attorneys only during the course of the motion or trial. The judge will rule on each such objection and the scoring attorneys shall consider the violation in evaluating the performance of the individual team members involved. **None of these objections may be raised in the post-trial proceedings.**

1. Costumes and theatrical makeup are prohibited. In keeping with the educational philosophy and objectives of the Mock Trial program, teams should concentrate on presenting the trial in a realistic manner, with witnesses wearing appropriate courtroom attire and using their normal speaking voices. Portrayals of racial or ethnic stereotypes are inappropriate and should not be used.
2. Physical evidence, other than the diagram, shall, after introduction, be placed on the prosecution counsel table and remain there, except when being used in the examination of witnesses. No objections to the placement of the physical evidence by counsel will be permitted.
3. **Witnesses will be excused at the beginning of the trial (unlike state rules).** Once a witness has testified, he/she must remain in the courtroom at all times.
4. Only the direct and cross-examination attorneys for a particular witness may make objections during that testimony.
5. There will be no objections allowed during opening or closing arguments.

It is solely the student attorneys' responsibility to bring a rule infraction matter to the presiding judge's attention, including any mistakes and/or omissions made by the judge.

Any situation not specifically covered in this document will follow the rules as outlined in the CRF Mock Trial Casebook and Rulebook.

Post Trial Objections

The violation of certain Mock Trial rules is not part of the regular courtroom process of attorney objections and may only be raised following the close of the trial. At the close of each trial, one student attorney from each side may confer with the team's attorney coach and teacher coach for thirty (30) seconds. The student attorney from each team will then have thirty (30) seconds in which to advise the court of any alleged violations of the following rules (and only those rules), and allowed fifteen (15) seconds for rebuttal. Each scoring attorney will determine whether there has been a violation and will deduct the points from the individual or team score as indicated. Scoring attorneys may not consult the presiding judge or other scoring attorneys in making the determination. Each scoring attorney shall apply penalties for the following infractions:

1. Teacher coaches may identify themselves by **team number only** to the presiding judge prior to the trial presentation. (A chart with school team names and numbers will be posted at the courthouse for each round.)

Penalty: 1 point deducted from team participation score.

2. Attorney coaches may **not** identify themselves to the presiding judge or scoring attorneys prior to the trial presentation.

Penalty: 1 point deducted from team participation score.

3. Teacher and attorney coaches leaving the seating area during the trial may **not** return until the completion of the trial.

Penalty: 1 point deducted from team participation score.

4. The teacher and attorney coaches, other team members, and spectators may not talk, signal, and/or otherwise communicate with the competing team members, including witnesses seated in the courtroom audience or in the hallway waiting to testify.

Penalty: 2 points deducted from team participation score.

5. Once a witness has testified, he/she must remain in the courtroom.

Penalty: 1 point deducted from witness score.

6. Student attorneys may not leave the courtroom during the trial except in an emergency at the direction of the presiding judge.

Penalty: 1 point deducted from team participation score.

7. A team may not request a recess for any reason. If, during the course of a round, the presiding judge allows an interruption in the trial for any reason, team members, coaches, and attorneys shall remain seated and shall not confer or otherwise communicate among themselves.

Penalty: 2 points deducted from team participation score.

Judge and Scoring Attorney Critique

No critiques will be given to the teams after the completion of each round. However, presiding judges, scoring attorneys, and students may remain after each round to discuss individual performances.

Responsibilities of Clerk and Bailiff

It is the bailiff's duty to ensure that no food, gum, or drink is brought into the courtroom, and that the courtroom is returned to order after trial. No member of the audience shall be removed from the courtroom by the bailiff without first being given a warning. A signed checklist confirming inspection of the courtroom must be signed by the team bailiff and returned to the designated scoring attorney collecting score sheets at the conclusion of each round of competition.

Spectators will not be admitted to the courtroom except during breaks between pre-trial arguments, opening and closing statements, and the examination of witnesses. The bailiff shall be responsible for enforcing this rule.

Teams are also directed to the rule (in the case materials) that states the bailiff must bring a copy of the state rulebook (available on the CRF website) to the trial for use by the presiding judge (in the event the judge requests it).

The clerk will be the official timekeeper. (There will be no “unofficial timer” as permitted by CRF rules.) The completed timesheet will be turned in to the designated scoring attorney collecting score sheets at the conclusion of each round.

The prosecution will provide the clerk, and the defense will provide the bailiff for each round. The clerk and bailiff will also act as the liaison between the team and competition coordinators during the competition.

Pretrial Motion

A pretrial motion is required for the state championship; therefore, it will be part of the county competition. Pretrial arguments will be presented before every trial of each round and will count toward the scoring for each round.

Lunch

Teams must provide their own lunches on the Saturday dates of the competition. Teams that do not have a meeting/lunch place within walking distance of the courthouse may contact the Riverside County Bar Association, (951) 682-1015, to make arrangements to use a local office.

Awards

A representative of the Steering Committee will act as chairperson of the Blue Ribbon Awards Committee. Blue Ribbon Awards are presented to students whose presentations during the competition are noteworthy and merit special recognition. Attorney scorers will make nominations during Rounds 1, 2, 3, and 4 of the competition. The Blue Ribbon Awards Nomination Form, identifying which student is assigned to each role, shall be provided by the clerks and bailiffs prior to each round. When completing the awards nomination form, teacher coaches should follow the instructions on the form. Do not circle any of the numbers on the Awards Nomination Form. If there are any suggestive marks on your form, it will not be considered for student nomination. Teacher coaches must bring five copies of the **typed or clearly printed** Awards Nomination Form **on blue paper** to each round (1, 2, 3, and 4) of the competition.

Individual medals will be presented for outstanding prosecution and defense attorneys, clerk, bailiff, prosecution and defense witnesses, prosecution and defense pretrial motion attorneys, and defendant. All students nominated for a Blue Ribbon award during Rounds 1, 2, 3, and 4 will receive a gavel pin. The pins will be provided to the team coach(es) for distribution to nominees. All students will receive a certificate of participation for competing in the Riverside County Mock Trial competition.

The Awards Ceremony for Rounds 1 through 4 will be held at 2 p.m. on Saturday, February 25, 2012, at the Moreno Valley Conference and Recreation Center, Moreno Valley. The Elite Eight teams will be announced during the ceremony. Following the Elite Eight round, admission tickets will be required of spectators wishing to attend the Semi-Final rounds on March 3, 2012. Each participating team will be provided a specific number of tickets for distribution to spectators.

Awards for teams competing in the Semi-Final and Final rounds will be presented at the conclusion of competition in the Riverside County Historic Courthouse, Department 1, on March 3, 2012, at approximately 3:30 p.m. (*immediately following the round*). Individual medals will be presented to each member of the county first, second, and third place teams. (There will be two third place teams rather than a third and fourth place team.)

The Riverside County Office of Education will pay the registration fee for the winning team to compete at the state competition, and will provide a stipend of \$1,000 to support the winning team's expenses for participation at the state competition. The winning team will be responsible for expenses beyond the \$1,000 and for coordinating their travel arrangements to the state competition.

Lost and Found

Any found items should be turned in to competition headquarters. Items may be claimed by contacting the Riverside County Office of Education facilitator.

Code of Ethics

At the first meeting of the Mock Trial team, the Code of Ethics should be read and discussed by the students, teacher coach(es), and attorney coach(es). All participants in the Mock Trial competition must adhere to the same high standards of scholarship that are expected of students in their academic performance.

Plagiarism of any kind is unacceptable. Students' written and oral work must be their own. Encouraging adherence to these high principles is the responsibility of each teacher coach. Any matter that arises regarding this code will be referred to the coach(es) of the teams involved.

Rules and Guidelines

The following rules and guidelines are to be observed by all participating teams and their coaches (teacher and attorney) and all competition observers. It is hoped that all teams will "police" themselves. In those circumstances where there is a violation brought to the attention of the Steering Committee, the Steering Committee will contact the offending team to bring it into compliance with the rule in question. Sanctions may be imposed at the discretion of the Steering Committee. Violations could result in the team not being permitted to participate in the remaining rounds of the competition.

- Teams are encouraged to scrimmage with teams from within Riverside County and from other counties prior to competition.
- Teacher coaches, attorney coaches, and students are not allowed in the scoring room for any reason.
- Riverside County Mock Trial teams or their affiliates **may not** videotape or record other county Mock Trial competitions.
- Rounds in the Riverside County Competition may be videotaped **only with the consent of both teams**, and as long as videotaping does not become disruptive. Each side is permitted one camera and must use existing courtroom lighting.
- Teacher coaches and attorney coaches are not to hold team meetings in the hallways of the courthouse.
- Team or school apparel (jackets, t-shirts, hats, sweatshirts, etc.) may **not** be worn in the courthouse by participating team members, coaches, or observers. In addition, nothing should be brought into the courtroom that would identify a team by school name (i.e., binders, notebooks, printed materials).
- Students, teachers, attorney coaches, and other team representatives may **not** observe other Riverside County team competition rounds during the Riverside County competition – **no scouting**.

- Teacher coaches are in charge of organizing the seating in each courtroom. The courtroom will be divided in half, and each team will be assigned one side of the courtroom. Unoccupied seats on the opposite side may be utilized with that teacher coach's permission.
- Rude gestures or obscenities will **not** be tolerated.
- Chewing of gum is not permitted in the courthouse. In the courtrooms, the bailiff will be responsible for correcting any violation.
- Spectators will not be admitted to the courtroom except during breaks between pre-trial arguments, opening and closing statements, and the examination of witnesses. The bailiff shall be responsible for enforcing this rule.
- To minimize disruptions, spectators should not leave the courtroom when witnesses are testifying or attorneys are speaking.
- It is understood that all team members, coaches, and attorneys will conduct themselves in a professional and courteous manner during the competition and in electronic or other communications on school and/or CRF websites. Participants violating this rule will be warned. Subsequent violations could result in the school's team not being permitted to participate in future competitions. The Code of Ethics will be strictly adhered to in the county and state competitions.
- All teams entering the Riverside County Mock Trial competition shall sign an agreement to follow the rules outlined in this document. The Riverside County Office of Education shall provide the agreement form, which must be signed and filed prior to participation in Mock Trial events.
- The only note taking allowed during the trial will be the teacher and/or attorney coaches of the teams participating in their assigned courtroom. Notes may **not** be shared with any other team.
- Only official attorney scorers and one video camera operator (with permission by both teams) per school may sit in the jury box. Non-coaching observers may sit in the jury box with the court's permission only if there are no other seats available in the courtroom.
