1. **PUBLIC HEARING 1 - PUPIL TEXTBOOK AND INSTRUCTIONAL MATERIALS COMPLIANCE FOR ALTERNATIVE EDUCATION AND SPECIAL EDUCATION FOR 2012-13.**

Pursuant to Education Code Section 60119, a Public Hearing will be held to determine that each pupil enrolled in a school has sufficient textbooks or instructional materials, or both, that are aligned to the content standards adopted pursuant to Education Code Section 60605 in each of the following subjects, as appropriate, that are consistent with the content and cycles of the curriculum framework adopted by the state board: Mathematics, Science, History-Social Science, English/Language Arts, including the English Language development component of an adopted program, foreign language and health courses. The governing board shall also make a written determination as to whether each pupil enrolled in a foreign language or health course has sufficient textbooks or instructional materials that area consistent with the content and cycles of the curriculum frameworks adopted by the state board for those subjects. The governing board shall also determine the availability of laboratory science equipment as applicable to science laboratory courses offered in grades 9 to 12, inclusive.
